

The Easter Story

- What makes me happy and unhappy
- What made Jesus' friends happy and unhappy at Easter time?
- Which things do Christians eat at Easter to remind them of the story?

Read the relevant chapters in 'The Storyteller Bible'.

Look at pictures in 'A Very Special Sunday' Big Book.

Listen to some sad/happy music, such as Bach's Easter Oratorio, and ask the children to imagine how the feelings of Jesus' friends changed over the Easter weekend.

Look at a sad face picture – turn it upside down to see a happy face. A copy of this can be downloaded here.

Read 'Sad News, Glad News'. Think about the symbolism of hot-cross buns (sadness) and Easter eggs (new life/hope/happiness).
